

## What You Think, Know, and Want to Know About Cannabis as Medicine Results

- 72 adults completed the survey.
- A majority of respondents were from Hamilton, Butler, Warren, Clermont, and Montgomery counties.
- 62.5% of respondents agree with the legalization of medical cannabis.
- 34.5% of respondents agree with the legalization of recreational cannabis.
- 30% of respondents agree that the age limit for being recommended medical cannabis should be younger than 21.
- 33% of respondents agree that the age limit for being recommended medical cannabis should be older than 21.
- 47% of respondents agree that there is NOT enough research surrounding cannabis and medical cannabis.
- 43% of respondents believe they are knowledgeable about the laws surrounding cannabis and medical cannabis.
- 82% of respondents would like to see more educational opportunities for the community about medical cannabis.
- The top 5 topics that respondents were interested in learning more about were mental health effects, physical health effects, research, cannabis law, and youth usage.
- 64% of respondents answered correctly when asked if people can still face penalties for possession of cannabis in places it has been decriminalized.
- 48% of respondents answered correctly when asked if it is legal to smoke cannabis as medicine in Ohio.
- 93% of respondents answered correctly when asked if people can still be charged for operating a vehicle impaired (OVI) if they have a medical cannabis card.
- 95% of respondents answered correctly when asked if people can still be drug tested by an employer even if they have a medical cannabis card.
- 87.5% of respondents answered correctly when asked if medical cannabis is prohibited on Ohio college campuses including dorm rooms and at university-sponsored events and activities.
- 81% of respondents answered correctly when asked if Public housing and Housing Choice Voucher programs must deny admission if a potential tenant uses cannabis or medical cannabis.
