- Strengthen the prevention workforce and infrastructure by providing training, technical assistance, & mentoring.





Survey Methodology

- Modified version Pride Surveys' questionnaire
- Administered every two years 12th cycle since 2000
 - Collected September 15, 2021 December 17, 2021
- Both online and paper versions
- 26,260 seventh through twelfth grade students from 60 schools completed the survey.
- Respondents from public & private schools across 4 counties in southwest Ohio.

Definitions

- Alcohol: Beer; Liquor; Coolers, hard lemonade, hard seltzers etc.
- Tobacco: Cigarettes; Smokeless Tobacco; Cigars, Cigarillos or Little Cigars
- Marijuana: Weed, Pot, Kush, etc.
- Prescription Drugs: Pain medication; Stimulant; Sleeping medication; Sedative/Anxiety
- E-vapor: Electronic Vapor Product, E-cigarettes, Vaping Pens, E-cigars, E-pipes, Vape pipes, E-Hookah, Hookah Pens, etc.

Definitions

- Risk Factors: characteristics at the biological, psychological, family, community, or cultural level that precede and are associated with a higher likelihood of negative outcomes.
- **Protective Factors:** characteristics associated with a lower likelihood of negative outcomes or that reduce a risk factor's impact. Protective factors may be seen as positive countering events.

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

Prevalence of Use

| 2022 Student Survey | During the past 30-Days |
|---------------------|-------------------------|
| Alcohol | 11.4% |
| Electronic-Vapor | 11.2% |
| Marijuana | 7.1% |
| Cigarettes | 2.5% |
| Prescription Drugs | 2.0% |

National Comparison of 12th gr.

| 30-Day Use | Student Survey 2022 | National* 2021 |
|--------------------|------------------------|-------------------|
| Alcohol | 23.8% | 25.8% |
| Cigarettes | 4.2% | 4.1% |
| Marijuana | 14.9% | 19.5% |
| Prescription Drugs | 1.7% | 2.1% |
| Electronic Vapor | 18.1% | 19.6% |




Perception of Harm

| Tobacco | 84.9% |
| Marijuana | 60.6% |
| Prescription Drugs | 82.5% |
| Electronic-Vapor | 68.3% |



Perception of Harm






Perception of Parental Disapproval

Perception of Parental Disapproval






Perception of Friend Disapproval

Perception of Friend Disapproval






Perception of Availability

| Electronic-Vapor | 13.4 yrs. |

| Students help each other when they are hurt or upset. | 44.6% |
| At least one adult in my school really cares about me. | 54.3% |
| Teachers help students cope with stress. | 34.8% |
| Teachers in our school tell me that it's okay to have my feelings. | 38.8% |
